A Message from the Executive Director

Greenway purchases property

With funding assistance from the State of Washington's Interagency Committee on Outdoor Recreation's Salmon Recovery Fund, the Greenway just closed on the purchase of 40 acres of riparian property.

Located at the southern end of the Yakima Reach, the property lies between a 100-acre parcel already owned by the Greenway to the north and Century Landing to the south. The property is in the floodway of the Yakima River and is bisected by the main channel and several side channels.

Virtually inaccessible other than by water, the property is home to a wide variety of wildlife, including deer, beaver, otter, hawks, quail, geese,

ducks and herons. The side channels provide valuable resting-places for salmon on their journey to and from the Pacific Ocean. Any future use of the property will be limited by the restrictive covenant that the property be utilized for salmon habitat, first and foremost.

Greenway maintenance crew stays busy in winter

I have been asked several times, "What do park maintenance people do during the winter?" While not nearly as busy as the warmer months when we hire seasonal employees to help, the winter months are nonetheless a busy time for the crew.

Besides removing snow from parking lots and paths, they are busy with equipment maintenance, refurbishing

picnic tables, trimming brush and trees, and generally completing all those little tasks that seem to get set aside during the summer. In addition, there are still over 100 garbage cans that need to be checked and emptied, restrooms to be cleaned and painted, and yes, even litter to pick up.

E.A.G.L.E. Earth Day

Learning about our environment is a complex and lifelong process, and the Yakima Greenway strives to help area students with this aspect of their education. 2005 will mark the 17th annual E.A.G.L.E. (Environmental Awareness Greenway Led Education) Earth Day. During those years, the Greenway has enabled a diverse variety of organizations to share their environmental messages with our area's youngsters. E.A.G.L.E. was developed in the Spring of 1989 as an opportunity for Yakima County students to learn about the world around them. The program's goals are to promote skills and attitudes that will enhance knowledge of the natural environment and to reduce our future rate of vandalism by investing our young citizens with a sense of ownership and pride in the Greenway.

This year, E.A.G.L.E. Earth Day will be held Friday, April 22. We anticipate a dozen exhibitors, plus highly acclaimed entertainers *Buck and Elizabeth* will provide song and dance during the lunch hour. Classrooms and home school families in grades K-6 are invited to join us for a fun-filled day of learning in Sarg Hubbard Park.

Gap2Gap

Don't miss Gap2Gap weekend on June 3-4! Starting with the pasta feed Friday, June 3, through the Junior Gap2Gap and Gap2Gap relays, the Family Festival, and Rock the Gap Saturday, June 4, there is something for athletes and non-athletes alike.

Gather a group of friends or co-workers, or take the Iron challenge in the Gap2Gap Relay. The relay is comprised of a field (cross-country) run, mountain bike, kayak/canoe, road bike, and 10K run legs. The shorter Sport course has an inline skate leg in lieu of the water leg, a shorter mountain bike leg, and a 5K run.

The Junior Gap2Gap is a five-stage relay for kids 8-14. Teams made up of 2-5 kids (or solo 11-14 year olds) navigate an obstacle course, rollerblade, paddle in Reflection Pond, bike, and run. There will be prizes awarded to the top teams in each category and all participants will receive a Junior Gap2Gap t-shirt. This kids' race has grown by leaps and bounds the past couple of years; bring your kids out to be part of the fun.

Registration packets will be available in April from the Greenway office and at local gyms and sporting goods stores.

Construction Project to Impact the Greenway

As the Washington State Department of Transportation enters the construction phase of a complete rebuild of Highway 24 from 18th Street to Keyes Road, the Greenway pathway and Robertson Landing parking lot will be impacted by construction. Part of this project will be to construct a new, much longer and higher bridge across the Yakima River.

During construction, the continuity of the pathway will be severed at that point. Starting later this year and scheduled to last 18 months, this multi-million dollar project will not only relieve traffic congestion and replace an existing substandard bridge, the new bridge will have a bicycle and pedestrian lane added to it. It will be a short-term inconvenience with a long-term improvement to both vehicle and non-motorized traffic as well as set the stage for improvements to riparian habitat.

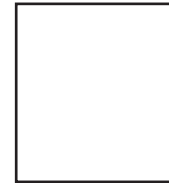
